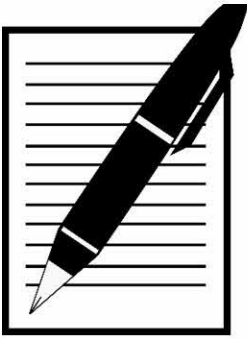

Greeting us was a beautiful manicured grass plaza at which were set small tables near an hors d'oeuvre counter. A feeling of calmness accented by the lush fruit dangling from the carefully pruned trees contrasted with the excitement of the guests.

For me, personally, this was a chance to meet the beautiful bride, and chat for a while with her mother. The guests came from England, Israel and the US and presented a gamut of religious observance, to be deduced by their attire.

I, of course, was delighted to see Mickey and Sam Harris, their daughter Becky and her daughter Hannah. I am especially close with the Sanders boys since I had taught them in the Shul Nursery School and afterward, privately, for as long as eleven years. What a treat it was to see the three brothers joining their father under the chuppah, each one chanting a "sheva brocha"!

Following the chuppah, we walked a short distance where the tables were set and the main meal, tasty and healthful, was served, preceded by and interrupted by very lively dancing. The joy was palpable and I am so grateful that I had the

opportunity to share in this ceremony of happiness for the Chatan, Kallah and their families.

In addition, Honi, Akiva and Yinon spent the next several days at my home participating in night time "Sheva Brachot" here, after which their father and his bride flew to London for more "sheva brachot" celebrations. Mazel Tov to the whole family.!
