Letter from Jerusalem

An Extraordinary Shabbos:

My grandson, Yehudah, who while learning full time in his first year of Yeshivah here, occasionally stops in to play piano duets with me, use the computer, and enjoy a schwarma in the nearby shop.

At a recent visit, he regaled me and my guests with the following account of his recent Shabbos. His account began thusly:

My son Rashi, Yehudah's father, has a friend who founded a voluntary

organization called One Family. Its purpose is to provide support for victims of terrorist attacks and their families. Sadly, there is a real need for such an organization here.

Yehudah was invited to this family for Shabbos, along with another guest. This guest was a twenty year old air force officer who instructs people in the use of the famous iron dome. (In Hebrew, Kipat HaBarzel.)The young officer had won first place in the air force chess competition and had come to spend his first Shabbos in a religious environment in order to play chess with Natan Sharansky, chairman of the Jewish Agency, who lives nearby. In addition to his prestigious background, Sharansky is the second best Russian chess player. He even bested Gary Kasparov, the world's number one chess champion when Kasparov was playing a simultaneous game.

After the Friday night meal, my grandson accompanied his hosts to the Sharansky home for dessert where Natan and the air force chess champion were just completing their fourth game. They each won twice.

Sharansky shared his thoughts and feelings regarding the recent attrocities in France. He had just returned from participating in the French memorial service for the tragic murder victims. He also remarked upon his nine years in a Russian gulag, including 405 days in solitary confinement in a small cell with three slices of bread and 3 cups of water each day. He joked how most champions become so excellent by playing in chess clubs, whereas he played chess in his mind while in jail.

As is well known, Sharansky was jailed a day after his wedding. His wife, Avital spent nine years campaigning for his release culminating in a famous release in

exchange for a Russian spy. During this time, Avital became religious and Natan followed suit upon being granted his freedom.

Yehudah's host Marc was asked to give a D'var Torah during the dessert, thus further enriching the Shabbos.

My young grandson was also privileged on a following Shabbos, to receive a blessing from the world famous Chareidi rabbi, Rabbi Kanievsky. He said that the Rabbi's apartment was filled in every available space, with Holy Books.

This rabbi was not Chassidish, but represents another stream of Orthodox Judaism, called Litvish, stemming from Lithuania or Latvia. The Rabbi blessed Yehudah with many blessings and much success.

All in all, Yehudah spent another wonderful Shabbos!
