One, Last Letter from Jerusalem

On Friday, September 9, 2016 at 8:21 AM, Saadia Simon wrote:

As many of you are aware, my dear grandmother, Mrs. Cyrelle Simon, passed away this past Wednesday, having lived close to a decade in her beloved Jerusalem. Shiva is being observed by her dear children, Shira, my father Rashi, Hillel, and Ronit through Monday morning in Bayit v'Gan, Jerusalem, and then through Wednesday morning in their respective hometowns - Bnei Brak, London, and Milwaukee.

On behalf of the family we would like to thank you all for being her audience in these letters. The letters which were eventually collected and published as "Welcome to Jerusalem: Adventures of a Newcomer" captured our hearts and minds and enabled her friends all over the world to peek into her experience - an experience that had both the fascination, vitality and positive outlook of a newcomer, and the comfort, deep connection, and familiarity of one who had fulfilled her lifelong dream and truly felt she had arrived home in Eretz Yisrael. In the past several months she had been preparing to publish a second volume; that task will now be left to us, her children and grandchildren, who are so privileged to follow in her footsteps.

She delighted in the feedback she received from the letters and in the correspondence she maintained with many of you.

As we approach the beginning of Shabbat here, I write with wishes that we may merit only joyous occasions in the future.
