

How Portugal's Jews Saved Themselves with a Sausage

The Alheira is a beautiful thing. This type of Portuguese sausage is known for garlic and breadcrumbs, and is so beloved in Portugal that it was voted one of the nation's seven gastronomic wonders in a 2011 vote. Oh, and it was invented by Jews to save their lives.

In the mid-1500s, at the peak of the Spanish Inquisition, Portugal's Jews went to great lengths to hide their religion, and in a mountain town in northern Portugal called Mirandela, this wasn't easy.

So the Jews did what they always do: they turned to food. Mirandela's Jews invented a new sausage, the Alheira de Mirandela, which they made with kosher chicken and bread and promptly hung from their rafters. Suspicion diverted.

These days, the Alheira is no longer associated with the Jews who invented it; you can find it made with all kinds of *treif*. A 2008 study found that 19.8% of Portuguese people have Jewish ancestry, though, and in 2013 Portugal became the second country after Israel with a Jewish right of return.
